What is the EAA Air Academy?

The Aviation Camps provide youths ages 16 through 18 the chance to get hands-on experience in several aspects of aviation.

Ground instruction and introductory recreation flight experiences highlight this action-packed camp. It combines “in-the-air” and “on-the-ground” hands-on activities. EAA Air Academy Aviation Camps are supervised and administered by top-notch aviation instructors and enthusiasts who offer more than 200 years of combined Academy teaching experience. From the moment a participant arrives, the sky becomes the goal as a dynamic aviation experience unfolds and close friendships with fellow aviation enthusiasts begin. All camps are conducted at the at the EAA Leadership Center in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, with the residence portion of the program at the impressive Air Academy Lodge.



The Air Academy Lodge is a 56-bed facility complete with great room, kitchen, dining room, computer room, conference space, flight simulation lab and recreational facilities.
