BOARD MEETING MINUTES

President Gorman called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

The General Meeting Notes from last week were given and approved with minor corrections and Vice President, Jim Manley, reported on some exciting upcoming speakers.

Homebuilder's Corner

Rolland LaPelle- coordinator



Last month I mentioned a tool that I made that can be used to remove rivets.



Have you ever drilled of the heads of rivets in order

to separate a sheet from another piece of sheet metal and then had to remove the rivet stubs from the other piece and found it too flimsily to drive them out with a punch. When I was working on the Beech I had to remove many panels for the mods I was doing so I made this tool which works great and doesn't damage the metal and eliminates trying to drill out the stubs.



What I did was I went to K-Mart and bought the cheapest pair of mechanics electrical pliers.

First I ground of the wire cutting edges and dulled the faces of the jaws teeth on the grinding wheel. I then ground off the chrome out side of the jaws.

I then drilled a hole for a 6-32 tap through both jaws and tapped the hole with a 6-32 tap through one

jaw. Then I drilled through the other jaw with a 3/8th drill and ground the end so the hole was as you see below.

Next I took a screw and ground it to a dull point as shown below.

The result is shown below. I also removed the handle spreading spring. This tool has saved me many hours of work and saved a lot of pieces from damage caused by trying to drill out stubs or trying to drive them out with a punch.



I will bring them to the next meeting for those who want to see it.
