A Salute to the Tuskegee Airman By Terri Gorman



On Veterans Day weekend, November 11th and 12th, the Tuskegee Airmen from Northern California were honored in two events, the first at the College of Marin on Sunday and the second on Monday in Marin City where there was a parade and reception in their honor.

On Sunday afternoon, David Cunningham, President of the William 'Bill' Campbell Chapter, which holds their meetings in Alameda, opened the event. David is a former member of EAA Chapter 62, a pilot who is based at Reid Hillview, and the son of Major John O. Cunningham, an original Tuskegee Airmen.

David turned the program over to Ray Taliaferro, KGO Talk Show Host, who introduced the Program Participants, which included several local Supervisors from Marin County as well as Congresswomen, Lynn Woolsey, Barbara Lee and State Senator Carole Migden, D-San Francisco.

Replicas of the Congressional Gold Medals awarded the airmen by President Bush last March were presented to 32 of the Tuskegee Airmen and a few of the Tuskegee widows who were seated on the stage. The auditorium was filled to capacity.

In Marin County, the best known member of the Tuskegee Airmen

was Archibald Williams. Archie, as his wife, Vesta, said was his real name, was an Oakland native and was a teacher of mathematics at Drake High School for 23 years. He died in 1993. Before the war, Archie Williams won a gold medal at the 1936 Olympics in Berlin.

Two of the Tuskegee Airmen who received their Congressional Gold Medals from President Bush in Washington, DC in March of 2007 were our friends, Captain Leslie Williams and Captain Woodie Spears. Many of you attended the presentation that I did at the Hiller Aviation Museum in February of 2006 for the Tuskegee Airmen. Les and Woodie were my speakers at this presentation.

The patron saint of the Tuskegee Airmen was Eleanor Roosevelt. In April 1941, Eleanor Roosevelt asked the head of the program, Charles Anderson, "Can Negroes really fly airplanes?" His answer was, "Certainly, they can, and would you like to go for a ride?" Anderson took her up for a half hour flight. After the flight, she returned to Washington and a short time later it was announced by FDR that the first Negro Air Corps pilots would be trained at Tuskegee Institute. Prior to 1941, the Army Air Corps had not allowed African-Americans in the service.

The Tuskegee Airmen was the popular name for a group of black Air Force members who flew with distinction during World War II. Of the more than 1,000 airmen who trained in Tuskegee in the early 1940's, 450 were fighter pilots who flew missions over North Africa and Europe. They logged 1,578 missions, destroyed 261 enemy aircraft and won over 850 medals. Their heroism and commitment to freedom and the United States of America was a major catalyst for integration of the United States Armed Forces. They overcame the enormous challenges of prejudice and discrimination and their stories are one of pride and determination, skill and leadership that will continue to inspire others for generations to come.

Throughout the afternoon, there were standing ovations for the Tuskegee Airmen and their widows who were present. Entertainment was provided by the magnificent voice of Lawrence Beamen. Corlette and Daniel Mack, young teenagers from Louisiana, danced to the tunes of good Jazz.
