goals were to (1) establish a connection between the school and their neighborhood airport, RHV and (2) give out info on our Young Eagles program under the guidance of member Russ Todd. We "presenters" had a great time and the classes were very polite and receptive. The "presenters" were Andy Werback, Terri Gorman, Russ Todd and Ron Carmichael. Ron spoke about the importance of getting to know Reid Hillview and how we adults in Chapter 62 can all be



mentors to help the students get more familiar with opportunities at this wonderful resource - only blocks away. He also showed a short video on Air Venture, showed slides of past Air Academy activity and went over the application process. Next, Russ Todd provided the students with an exciting example of model aviation involvement by demonstrating his R/C electric model with Ron holding it while walking around the class as Russ controlled the RPM. Exciting stuff for this age group of 15-16 year olds. Andy Werback then provided some terrific slides of his Lancair and the building process.
