

Homebuilder's Corner

So far no one has asked for any subject to be discussed, so I am going to tell you about my current project.

I am making a capacitive fuel gage system. This type of system has several advantages. One is no moving parts. Another is the sensor can be shaped so its profile



represents the tank volume. This then would measure the fuel in a tank which is shaped like a triangle longitually and a half moon shape in the lateral axis. In other words the sensor profile is shaped the same as the volume profile instead of the level giving an accurate reading on the volume of fuel remaining.

A couple of years ago Jim weir of RST Engineering came and spoke at our meeting when I was Vice President. I investigated his concept for the circuit and found it had a problem with auto fuel because of the variation of alcohol which changes the dielectric of the fuel. What I have done is to redesign the circuit so it automatically recalibrates to the fuel being used.

What Jim had used was a fixed oscillator for a reference. What I did is to drive that oscillator with a capacitor in the fuel line. After a bit of testing and modifications to the circuit and two generation of circuit boars I have a system that seems to work correctly. I am currently building o model of that system which will be able to keep track if the fuel in the tank being used even if that fuel is different from the other tanks, Right now I am trying to get the documentation cleaned up and building instruction written so kits can be made up if anyone wants such a system. This system will have warning system to indicate when to switch tanks to avoid the instant silence syndrome.

I have to announce that the time has come for me to step down from the board. My reasons for continuing was to get the board to plan and obtain there own place and to promote home aircraft building. Well I have been unable to get anyone to help with the coordination or help with the article even it only to make suggestions as to what they want to hear about or discuss. As far as getting our own place that can never happen as long as certain people on the board continue to think in a negative way. No one seems to be willing to allocate part of the moneys collected to the building fund but will spend it on everything else even giving it away. This means even if some one offered us a good situation for a reasonable price we couldn't take advantage of it. The sad thing is other organization manage to put on things to raise funds to get there own place but we are not currently willing to dedicate ourselves to do it.

It costs me \$76.00 a month to commute to two meetings a month and neither of my goals seems to have any chance of succeeding and being on a limited income I have had to take a job in Concord that

makes it difficult to have time to participate. I have decided to drop out and persue other activities that have more of a chance of succeeding. Next month will be my final article. If anyone would like to take over I will help them for as long as I can but if no one steps forward September will be my last month.
